

A School was Opened with the Support of the US Embassy in the Village of Kveshi Near the Occupation Line

A newly renovated public school has been opened in the village of Kveshi, Gori municipality, near the dividing line. The project was implemented with the financial support of the US Embassy, Corps of Engineers.

The opening ceremony was attended by the school children and their teachers together with the Minister of Education, Science, Culture and Sport Mikhail Chkhenkeli, The Ambassador in charge of the United States to Georgia, - Elizabeth Rudy, Shida Kartli State-representative George Khojevanishvili, the Mayor of Gori Municipality Konstantine Tavzarashvili, the Metropolitan of Gori and Ateni Diocese, - Andria Gvazava.

A three-storied building was fully rehabilitated, that cost \$800 000. The roof, windows and doors and the floor have been changed, a new heating system has been installed, the staircase has been reconstructed, toilets have been renovated, the perimeter of the school has been fenced. A newly rehabilitated public school in Kveshi will serve 247 pupils and 37 teachers.
